

NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING

Idaho Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Substantive Policy Revision Order of Selection and Customer Financial Participation

Notice is hereby given that the Idaho Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (IDVR), pursuant to the Rehabilitation Act, as amended by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), announce substantive modifications to agency policies. § 34 CFR 361.20(2)(v-vi) explicitly mandates that any modifications to either of these policies requires IDVR to conduct public meetings to notify customers and to offer an opportunity for comment on the proposed changes to the policies.

The purpose of this period of comment is to provide interested parties and/or organizations an opportunity to understand proposed changes and present their views and recommendations regarding the establishment and implementation of Order of Selection and modifications to the Customer Financial Participation agreement. TIPS FOR SUBMITTING EFFECTIVE COMMENT

Overview

A comment can express simple support or dissent for a proposed action. However, a constructive, information-rich comment that clearly communicates and supports its claims is more likely to have an impact on decision making.

These tips are meant to help the public submit comments that have an impact and help with plan implementation. Keep in mind that all comments received will become public record, personal information may be redacted.

Summary

- Be concise but support your claims.
- Base your justification on sound reasoning, scientific evidence, and/or how you will be impacted.
- There is no minimum or maximum length for an effective comment.
- The comment process is not a vote one well supported; specific comment is often more influential than a thousand comments.
- For each comment reference the associated page number.

Detailed Recommendations

- 1. Please include your affiliation if your comments represent an organization.
- Although agencies receive and appreciate all comments, constructive comments (either positive or negative) are the most likely to have an influence.
- 3. When crafting a comment, it is important that you adequately explain the reasoning behind your position.
- **4.** When possible, support your comment with data, facts, and/or opinions. You may also provide personal experience in your comment, as appropriate.
- 5. Consider including examples of how the policies would impact you negatively or positively.
